Our school will:

- Provide your child with a high standard of education, within a creative, fun and balanced curriculum.
- Ensure that our learning environment is stimulating and challenging.
- Support and celebrate your child's learning and personal achievements.
- Provide the scaffolding needed to enable your child to achieve and progress.
- Care for your child's safety and well-being.

Parents/Carers

The Learning Environment

As a Parent/Carer I will:

- Make sure my child arrives at school from 8.45am to 9am at the latest, prepared to start learning,
- Ensure that my child is wearing named school uniform/ their PE kit following the school uniform policy.
- Please remove jewellery including earrings.
- Read all information sent home as this gives me important details of relevant policies, meetings, workshops, activities, newsletters and open days.
- Do my very best to support learning at home for my child.
- Use the codes to access the Learning platform, Seesaw, Spelling Shed and Boom Reader.
- Work with the school to support my child and communicate openly in an environment of trust.

Healthy, Happy Community

As a Parent/Carer I will:

- Bring my child into school every day for their learning and support the school in creating an ethos in which good attendance (of at least 95%) and punctuality are recognised as the norm and seen to be valued by school and parents in partnership with each other.
- Understand that holidays will not be authorised within school terms (See our Attendance Policy.)
- Let the school know of any concerns or worries that may be affecting my child's learning, behaviour or ability to do homework, as this can then be resolved quickly.
- Have a positive attitude to others, regardless of gender, race, culture, belief, values, age and need.
- Support the school by encouraging my child to develop a positive attitude towards diversity in line with the school's zero tolerance policy on discrimination and bullying, whether in person or online.
- Understand and support the school's work on Online Safety and critical thinking, to ensure our children are confident and safe when online.
- Support the school in addressing any online behaviour online, which could put them or others at risk.
- Attend meetings with my child's teacher and other staff, aiming to be positive and productive, working towards moving my child on in their learning.
- Support and work with you to ensure that the behaviour management policies of the school are maintained, particularly with my child.
- Encourage a positive attitude towards my child's education and our school. If I have any concerns, I will come and discuss them in order to resolve any issues.
- Not make negative comments about the school or members of the school community on social media sites, but bring my concerns to the relevant people.
- Supporting your child's learning by making sure that home learning tasks are completed and returned on time.

Pupils

I will:

- Tell a member of staff if I am worried or unhappy.

Attendance at Bridgewater Primary School

Our joint commitment to our children.

Regular and punctual school attendance is vital. Pupils need to attend school regularly if they are to take full advantage of the educational opportunities available to them by law. Children who are persistently late or absent soon fall behind with their learning. Children who are absent from school frequently develop large gaps in their learning, which will impact on their progress and their ability to meet age-related learning expectations. A child whose attendance drops to 90% each year will, over their time at primary school, have missed two whole terms of learning by the end of Year 6.

Parents/carers hold the legal responsibility for ensuring their child's good attendance. The Headteacher and Governors at our school work together with other professionals and agencies to ensure that all pupils are encouraged and supported to develop good attendance habits. Any attendance below 95% is a cause for concern and may lead to intervention by the school. The exception to this is if evidence has been provided of illness, chronic or serious ill health.

Guidance states that any attendance below 90% will be classified as persistent absence.

We are committed to supporting pupils and families who have been experiencing any difficulties at home or at school which are preventing good attendance. This may include setting up a Parental Contract, which aims to support by identifying barriers and making positive steps to improve attendance.

Definitions

Authorised absence:

An absence is classified as authorised when a child has been away from school for a legitimate reason and the school has received notification from a parent or carer. For example, if a child has been unwell and the parent telephones the school to explain the absence. Children should return to school as quickly as possible after an illness. Only the school can make an absence authorised. Parents do not have this authority, consequently not all absences supported by parents will be classified as authorised.

Unauthorised absence:

An absence is classified as unauthorised when a child is away from school without the permission of the school. Therefore, the absence is unauthorised if a child is away from school without good reason, even with the support of a parent. Please note that holidays within term time are not permitted and will not be authorised and may be referred to West Northamptonshire Council.
