Our Learning



- We encourage a love of books and daily reading
- We support Maths mastery with White Rose Maths and Primary Stars daily
- A combination of whole class and small group learning
- High expectations of learning and outcome across the cohort
- We support Reading, phonics and writing with toolkits, story maps, washing lines, and explore a range of genres
- We nurture a strong support network of students, families and teachers
- Levels of challenge for all
- Morning Creative Circuits to support independent learning
- Chris Quigley curriculum for art, D&T, history and geography- children will be inspired, immersed and engaged in their learning



Phonics and Reading

- Reading follows the same pattern as Reception. The children begin on phonetically decodable books (Sounds Write books) before moving onto longer chapter books (white level and above).
- Please read with your child as much as possible.
- Please re-read books to build up fluency and expression.
- We visit the library once a week on Thursdays.
- Phonetically decodable books will be changed once your child has built sufficient fluency, expression and comprehension for each book. This may take several reads of the same book.
- The children will take the Phonics Screening Check in the Summer Term of Year 1. If any children do not pass it, they will retake it in the Autumn term of Year 2.

Questions to support reading

Vocabulary Questions with Victor

- Can you find a word/sentence that tells/shows you that...?
- Why do you think that the author used the word... to describe...?
- Can you find a word in the text that means the same as...?
- Find an adjective in the text



Inference Questions with Iggy

- What do you think.....means? Why do you think that?
- Why do you think. ?
- How do you think. ...?
- When do you think. ...?
- Where do you think. ?
- How has the author made us think that. ?



Retrieval Questions with Rex

- Who is/are the main character(s)?
- When/where is this story set?
- Which is your favourite/worst/funniest/scariest part of the story? Why?
- Tell me three facts you have learnt from the text.
- Find the part where...



Prediction Questions with Pip

- Where do you think. ...will go next?
- What do you think....will say / do next?
- What do you think this book will be about? Why?
- How do you think that this will end?
- Who do you think has done it?
- What might. ...say about that?



If you are not sure, say:

- Have a guess.
- What would you do if you were...?
- If you had done that, what might... have said?
- If we know that.... means. , what might....mean?
- Does the picture help us?
- Where else could we look for a clue?

Sequencing Questions with Suki

- What happens in the beginning of the story?
- How/where does the story start?
- What happened at the end of the. ?
- Can you retell the story to me in 20 words or less?
- What happened before that?



If you can't read a word, say:

- Can you break it up?
- Are there any sounds you know?
- Do you know a word that looks like it?
- What could it say?

Remember:

- Enjoy this moment.
- Share your thoughts and opinions about it too.
- Just five minutes every day makes a huge difference.

Home Learning

- Homework will be set on Seesaw every Friday and will be due in on the following Friday. This will alternate between the phonics sound they are learning, and a challenge linked to an area of their learning that week.
- We recommend you access your child's Numbots and Spelling Shed platform often.
- Spellings will be set and checked within handwriting and phonics sessions. These will be common exception words. Homework challenges will be set on Spelling Shed and Seesaw.

Trainers, socks, white T-shirt and dark blue/black jogging bottoms and top for outdoor **(Fridays)**

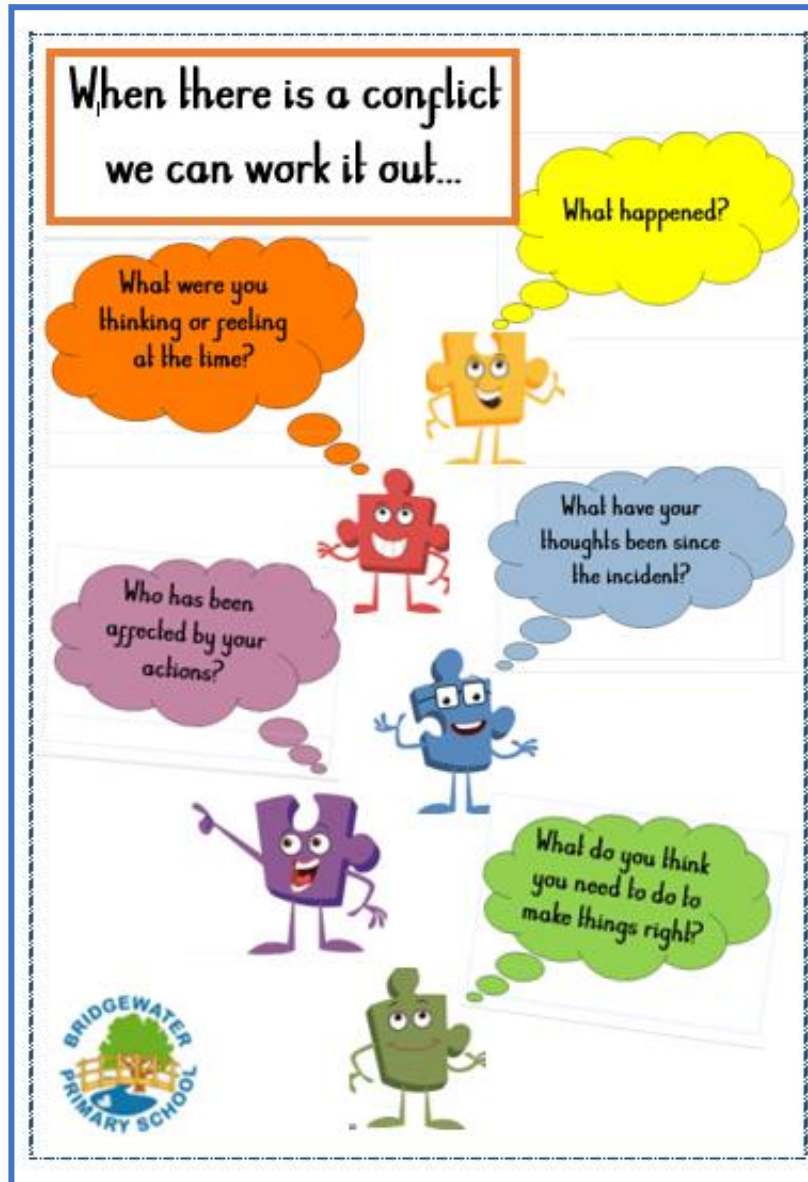
White T-shirt and blue/black shorts for indoor **(Thursdays)**

Restorative Justice at Bridgewater

Restorative approaches are used to help build positive relationships and encourage children to respect each other.



Restorative Questions:

To resolve conflicts and behaviour issues:

1. What happened?
2. What were you thinking about at the time?
3. What have been your thoughts since?
4. Who has been affected?
5. What do you think you need to do to make things right?

Pupil Premium Funding



The Pupil Premium is additional funding given to publicly funded schools in England. Anyone who qualifies will receive a £45 voucher towards school uniform.

Your child may be eligible for Pupil Premium if you are in receipt of one of the following benefits.

- Income Support
- Income based job seekers allowance
- Child Tax credit
- Employment and support allowance (income related)
- Universal credit (income dependant)

Pupil Premium funding is paid directly to the school to improve the quality of your child's education experience.
